What is the EERE Project Management Center?

- **Consists of NETL (Pittsburgh, PA and Morgantown, WV) and the Golden Field Office (Golden, CO)**
- **Manages about \$560 million of EERE funding in FY 2007**
- **Implements the EERE research, development, demonstration and deployment/market transformation portfolio**
- **Functions as an integrated organization which delivers products and services to the primary EERE customers and stakeholders**
- **Moving towards EERE's "one way of doing business"**



PMC States Coordinators: Roles and Responsibilities

- Serve as primary advocate for States and other key stakeholders for gathering, organizing and communicating PMC information and activities;
- Work within the PMC to ensure consistent information, processes and activities are being used;
- Maintain knowledge of all EERE programs and PMC activities in order to provide support for the outreach and communication to key stakeholders;
- Serve as liaison between EERE HQ, PMC, States, and other major stakeholders;
- Assist in implementing EERE and PMC priority activities; and
- Manage and coordinate crosscutting activities.

National Action Plan for Energy Efficiency

- **Presents policy recommendations and options for creating a sustainable, aggressive national commitment to energy efficiency through utilities, regulators, States, and partner organizations.**
- **Leadership Group is facilitated by U.S. DOE and U.S. EPA.**
- **Action Plan was developed by a Leadership Group of more than 50 leading utilities, regulators, State agencies, large energy users, consumer advocates, energy service providers, and energy efficiency/environmental groups.**
- **Over 90 organizations across 47 States have made commitments (including 24 State agencies, 30 utilities, and other advocates).**



National Action Plan for Energy Efficiency: Recommendations

- 1) Recognize energy efficiency as a high-priority energy resource.**
- 2) Make a strong, long-term commitment to implement cost-effective energy efficiency as a resource.**
- 3) Broadly communicate the benefits of and opportunities for energy efficiency.**
- 4) Promote sufficient, timely, stable program funding to deliver energy efficiency where cost-effective.**
- 5) Review and adopt policies to align utility incentives with the delivery of cost-effective energy efficiency and modify ratemaking practices to promote energy efficiency investments.**
