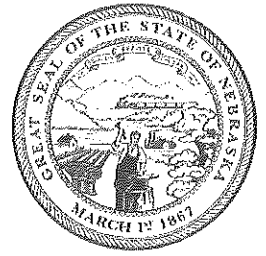

RE: State Certification of Residential and Commercial Building Energy Codes

Dear Sir or Madam:

In compliance with Title III of the Energy Conservation and Production Act (ECPA) of 1976, as amended, this is to certify that the State of Nebraska has updated the Nebraska Energy Code, which references the 2018 version of the International Energy Conservation Code (IECC) for low-rise residential buildings, as well as ASHRAE Standard 90.1-2016 for nonresidential buildings. Enclosed please find a copy of Nebraska's Legislative Journal for the Seventieth Day of the 106th Legislature-First Session, dated May 2, 2019, which includes the passage of LB 405 referencing the adoption of the 2018 IECC/ASHRAE Standard 90.1-2016 to the Nebraska Energy Code. The Nebraska Energy Code, referenced in LB 405, was advertised and a public hearing was held before the Urban Affairs Committee of the Nebraska Legislature on February 12, 2019. The code will become effective on July 1, 2020.
