Re: 2009 IECC and Standard 90.1-2007 New Hampshire Statement of Certification

To Whom It May Concern:

The New Hampshire Office of Energy and Planning (NHOEP) hereby certifies that the State of New Hampshire has a residential building energy code that meets the requirements of the 2009 IECC, and a commercial building energy code that meets ASHRAE Standard 90.1-2007.

The New Hampshire Building Code Review Board, which is a part of the State's Department of Safety, is charged with reviewing and proposing amendments to the State's building codes. Any changes approved by the Board must be ratified by the State Legislature within two years of adoption by the Board.

The Board considered adoption of the 2009 IECC and Standard 90.1-2007, provided public notice, and held a public hearing on May 8, 2009 at the NH Department of Safety in Concord, NH to provide an opportunity for public comment. Public comment was received and the NH Building Code Review Board then adopted the aforementioned standards effective April 1, 2010.

After additional public notice and public hearings, those codes were ratified by the Legislature on June 18, 2012. The codes can be found in NH RSA 155-A.
