RE: Certification of Commercial Energy Code Equivalency to ASHRAE Standard 90.1-2022.

Dear Mr. Williams:

In compliance with Title III of the Energy Conservation and Production Act (ECPA) of 1976, as amended, this letter hereby certifies that the State of Oregon has adopted the 2025 Oregon Energy Efficiency Specialty Code (OEESC) which utilizes ANSI/ASHRAE/IES Standard 90.1-2022 as the basis for the statewide energy code for commercial buildings.

The 2025 OEESC was adopted through an open public process, with final review and approval by the Construction Industry Energy Board (CIEB). Oregon, through the 2025 OEESC document, modified Standard 90.1-2022 to align with Oregon statutes. Any prescriptive exception pathways require equal, or better, offsetting energy efficiency requirements. Please find a copy of the Oregon Secretary of State's Permanent Rule Filing ([Notice of Permanent Rule](#)), filed December 23, 2024, which includes adoption of the OEESC. The OEESC became effective January 1, 2025.

Oregon appreciates continuing support from DOE for our use of Standard 90.1 with compliance tools, analysis, and enforcement materials.
